BACKGROUND

In 2024, CoEd and ADGN Education embarked on a yearlong, seven-part Impact Study focused mainly on CoEd's Rise Program, which provides over 1,000 students with scholarships & youth development. The study utilized Human–Centered Design, ensuring that beneficiaries have a guiding voice in determining program direction.

The learnings from this study provide a roadmap in the post-pandemic context for CoEd and other nonprofits to focus their limited resources and maximize their impact.

- Equip Rise students with high-quality technology skills to prepare them for jobs.
- Prepare kids to enter the job market through a new Career Connections Unit.
- Expand pathways to quality secondary and higher education by adding a boarding school and university residence for young women.
